Ed Fund Chosen To Pilot Citi Postsecondary

Success Program

n October 21st, the Philadelphia Education Fund held a press conference to publicly launch the Citi Postsecondary Success Program (CPSP). Several important education stakeholders, including Citi Foundation President and Chief Executive Officer Pamela Flaherty, Tomás Hanna, Chief of Staff to School District of Philadelphia Superintendent Arlene Ackerman, and Mayor Michael Nutter joined us as we introduced this new initiative.

CPSP is a five-year collaborative project to increase the number of low-income and first generation public high school students who enroll and succeed in postsecondary education. The Citi Foundation has provided a five-year \$5,150,000 grant to the Academy for Educational Development (AED) and the Public Education Network (PEN) to launch CPSP, working with three local education funds in Philadelphia, Miami, and San Francisco.

The Ed Fund is serving as the local implementation partner and will convene partnerships of critical stakeholders in K-16 education, youth-serving community organizations, city government, business and civic groups to develop a comprehensive approach to improving postsecondary education outcomes in the city. The Ed Fund will receive a \$600,000 five-year matching grant for planning and implementation.

Pamela Flaherty, President and Chief Executive Officer at the Citi Foundation, notes, "The Philadelphia

Education Fund has an exceptional record in building public/private coalitions that truly make a difference. We're looking forward to working with them to coordinate the efforts of the many organizations already out there working on college access and success to help more Philadelphia students realize their dreams of earning a postsecondary degree."

Philadelphia CPSP will impact low-income and first generation public high school students. Specifically, CPSP will work with Ben Franklin High School, Roxborough High School, Kensington Business High School, and Kensington Creative and Performing Arts High School through a broad-based partnership to

develop a model college access and success system. Key work will include coordinating and aligning services that support college preparation, contributing to school-wide college readiness cultures, and involving student and families in planning for college beginning in the ninth grade.

As part of a national CPSP evaluation, OMG Center for Collaborative Learning will collect data on student outcomes which will be used to identify barriers as well as to inform important changes in preparing students to enroll and succeed in college. Findings will be disseminated widely to key stakeholders to foster a better understanding of best practices in the postsecondary access and success arena.

Ed Fund Receives TTT Award

In October, the Ed Fund was awarded a highly competitive U.S. Department of Education Transition to Teaching grant to support Philadelphia Teacher Residency (PTR). This is a five-year, \$2.2 million award. With this support, PTR will recruit and retool 160 STEM [science, technology, engineering, and mathl professionals over the next five years to become math and science teachers in high-need School District of Philadelphia schools. The Ed Fund's PTR partners are the School District of Philadelphia, the Philadelphia Federation of Teachers, and the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Education, PTR is affiliated with the national organization, Urban Teacher Residency United, www.utrunited.org.

STAR ALUMNUS EDDY Acel Moore


Pulitzer Prize winner and *Philadelphia Inquirer* Associate Editor Emeritus, Acel Moore is a Philadelphia native and graduate of Overbrook High School. He began his journalism career in 1962 at the *Philadelphia*

Inquirer and quickly became a well-respected reporter. In 1977, Moore won the Pulitzer Prize, Heywood Broun, National Headliner, and Robert F. Kennedy awards for an investigative series of articles he co-authored on the abuse of inmates at Fairview State Hospital in Fairview, PA. Moore was the 3rd African American to win the Pulitzer Prize and the first to win the award for investigative journalism. Moore is a co-founder of the National Association of Black Journalists, and the Acel Moore Journalism Career Development Workshop for high school minority students interested in the field of journalism.
